WHEREAS, functional classification is the process by which streets and highways are grouped into classes according to the character of service they are intended to provide;

WHEREAS, Crawford County periodically reviews the system of streets and highways for appropriate changes to classification of the various segments of the system; and

WHEREAS, a recent review of the system has revealed the need for a change to the federal functional classification of a road segment due to the lack of classification continuity.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of Crawford County, Iowa, hereby request the Iowa Department of Transportation to request the Federal Highway Administration to make the following changes in federal functional classification.

CHANGES TO FEDERAL FUNCTIONAL CLASSIFICATION SYSTEM

Revise the federal functional classification from Local to Minor Collector for that portion of Ridge Road commencing at the Denison City Limits then extending north and east a distance of 105 feet or 0.02 miles to the intersection with M Ave.
