The Board of Supervisors met at 9:00 o’clock A.M. with Dave Muhlbauer, chair presiding. Members present were Schultz, Dozark, Muhlbauer, Heiden, and Rosburg.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The Board approved the Clerk of Court fees for April 2025.

A motion was made by Heiden, seconded by Rosburg to approve the IDOT Federal-Aid Agreement for Surface Transportation Block Grant Program Agreement No. 3-25-STBG-S-020, Project No. STP-S-TSF-CO24(135)—5P-24, HMA Pavement Widening/HMA Resurfacing on Co Rd L51, from South Corp Limits of Charter Oak S 14.9 miles to Intersection with Hwy 37.

Motion passed unanimously.

At 10:03 o’clock A.M., as advertised, a motion was made by Dozark, seconded by Heiden to open the public hearing regarding the Budget Amendment for FY 2024/2025. Motion passed unanimously. There were no written or oral objections. A motion was made by Schultz, seconded by Rosburg to close the public hearing at 10:04 o’clock A.M. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by Schultz, seconded by Dozark to approve the following resolution:

Hazard Mitigation Assistance Program

WHEREAS, the Crawford County Emergency Management Agency, County of Crawford, has made application through the Iowa Department Homeland Security and Emergency Management (HSEMD) to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for funding from the Hazard Mitigation Assistance Program, in the amount of \$25,000 for the total project cost, and

WHEREAS, the Crawford County Emergency Management Agency recognizes the fact that this grant is based on a cost share basis with the federal share not exceeding 75%, the state share not exceeding 10%, and the local share being a minimum of 15% of the total project cost. The minimum 15% local share can be either cash or in-kind match. and

THEREFORE, the Crawford County Emergency Management Agency agrees to provide and make available up to \$3,750 of local monies to be used to meet the minimum local match requirement for this mitigation grant application.

A motion was made by Heiden, seconded by Schultz to approve the hiring of outside legal counsel, Kristopher Madsen of Stuart Tinley Law Firm, – update from ICAP.
