

RESOLUTION NO. 2004-16

Regarding the replacement of damaged mailboxes placed along Secondary Roads in Crawford County, Iowa.

WHEREAS, the Crawford County Board of Supervisors recognizes the need for rural residents to place mailboxes adjacent to secondary roads at many locations within the county, and

WHEREAS, periodically a mailbox may be damaged during normal roadway maintenance operations such as: blading, mowing and snow removal, and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined it necessary to establish a policy for the repair or replacement of damaged mailboxes:

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Crawford County, Iowa, that the following policy be adopted regarding the repair and or replacement of mailboxes damaged by Secondary Road maintenance operations.

When it has been determined by the County Engineer that damage has occurred to a mailbox resulting from Secondary Road maintenance operations. The County Engineer will direct secondary road employees to either repair or replace said mailbox in accordance with the severity of the damage.


When it has been determined that a mailbox has been damaged to the point that it must be replaced, a new mailbox; plain galvanized normal small size, will be issued to owner. Mailboxes thus provided must be mounted on a 4"x4" wood post.

When a mailbox post has been damaged or broken, Crawford County will replace the post with a 4"x4" wood post. When frost prevents the installation of a wood post Crawford County will provide to the owner a temporary mailbox unit. Said temporary unit shall be provided until such time as conditions allow the installation of the wood post.

In lieu of the aforementioned, the owner of said damaged mailbox shall be entitled to a cash reimbursement equivalent to the cost of a plain galvanized normal size box and a 4" x 4" wood post.
